

Public transport in Stockholm

Single journey

The cost for a journey, up to 75 minutes, is 42 SEK.

It is possible to use a contactless card to buy a single journey.

Travelcard fare

A smart phone app, SL-reseplanerare och biljetter, is free of charge and can be downloaded from App Store or Google Play. You can buy a travel pass for 1, 3 or 7 days using the SL app.

- 24 hours: SEK 175 (adult fare); SEK 110 (discounted fare)
- 72 hours: SEK 350 (adult fare); SEK 220 (discounted fare)
- 7 days: SEK 455 (adult fare); SEK 290 (discounted fare)
- 30 days: SEK 1,020 (adult fare); SEK 650 (discounted fare)

You pay the discounted fare if you are over 65 years of age, or if you are under 20 years of age. 7 days travelcards, and travelcards for longer periods of time, are valid from 00.00 on the first day of travel until 04.30 on the day after the travelcard expires. The 24 hour and 72 hour travelcards are valid for the chosen number of hours from the time of first use.

All travelcards and tickets are valid for travel on the Djurgården ferries between Slussen and Djurgården, as well as commuter ferries 80, 83, 84 and 89.

Travel to Karolinska University Hospital by public transport.

Bus 3, 6, 77 and 507 stop by the Karolinska Hospital

Depending on where you are staying you may take the bus all the way to the hospital.

Closest subway station is St Eriksplan, change there to Bus 3, 6, 77 or walk along Torsgatan changing into Solnavägen, 15 minutes from St Eriksplan to the Karolinska Hospital

If travelling by commuter train, the closest station is Odenplan
